From the beginning of September 2020, St. Oliver's has potentially avoided the sale of 12,228 water bottles in an exciting new project.

St. Oliver's Community College rolled out a new water dispenser initiative in the school to cut down on single use plastics. The trendy new system is automatic so that staff and students simply place their bottle into the holding area and wait for it to fill up. The dispenser then has the technology to count how much water is dispensed and in turn, how many plastic bottles have been spared. The school provided every student with their own reusable water bottle which are colour coded for each year group. This is a monumental step in St. Oliver's attempt to go green. The school canteen has also rallied to the cause with a drastic reduction in the amount of single use plastic bottles on sale.
